LOCATION:

Webelos Resident Camp is held at Beaumont Scout Reservation, which sits on over one thousand acres along the beautiful Grand River in Ashtabula County. The camp is located just seven miles south of I-90 at exit #223 (Route 45) near Rock Creek, Ohio. Camp Beaumont is about an hour drive from downtown Cleveland.



While at Cape Beaumont, our Webelos Commanders (Boys entering the 4th or 5th grade in the fall) will have vigorous training to hone their skills. Their regiment will be determined by grade, while still sharing common times.

Both will be earning their Aquanaut at Lunar Falls, Geologist at the Environmental Lab, and completing either all or most of the requirements of Sportsman at Area 51.
